WELCOME

PIERCE-The American College of Greece has a 136 year tradition and history in providing excellent secondary education. The Summer Camp is an extension of that tradition. For over twenty-three years the Camp has been the setting for memorable experiences for thousands of children. A rich and balanced program of sports, art and academics actively supports The American College of Greece's strong belief in the ancient Greek dictum *Nous Eigis en Somati Eigi* (A Sound Mind in a Sound Body).

PROGRAM

MORNING (9:00-12:15)

The morning program is a combination of sports instruction and recreational activities. Within this period, the children have sports instruction based on their skill level and age, and free time to enjoy recreational activities. A refreshing 20 minute juice break occurs between activities.

SPORTS – Children can choose 2 sports from five different offerings. Classes include the teaching of sports skills through drills and fun games. Activities take place in an environment of safety and non-competitiveness.

RECREATION – The recreation period is less structured and affords children the opportunity to choose a different recreational activity each day. Table games, coloring, ping pong, hand soccer, and badminton are some of those activities.

LUNCH (12:30-13:15)

The menu is selected by the Camp nutritionist and is designed to meet the nutritional needs of active children. Emphasis is placed on healthy food options. A different menu is arranged in ten day segment, and then repeated. It is prepared fresh daily by the College's culinary staff.

AFTERNOON (13:30-16:30)

The afternoon program combines the arts and academics. Children are placed in classes according to their age and level of knowledge. In between activities a light snack is served.

ARTS – Five different art classes are offered in the afternoon. The arts program is designed to make children aware of the many options available to explore the artistic side of their personality.

ACADEMICS – Several levels of classes are offered in two subjects that are essential in today's world; Computers and English. Most classes are taught by PIERCE and DEREI faculty with small teacher to student ratios.

FACILITIES

The athletic facilities of the American College of Greece are of world class standards and scope. They include a 50 meter swimming pool, four enclosed basketball courts, six outdoor tennis courts, three studios and a FIFA certified synthetic soccer field.

Similarly, the classrooms are state of the art. They are spacious, clean and fully equipped. Many of the rooms are air conditioned and some are multi-media ready.
